# **Basketball**

Many of you will recall that this time last year we were crowned regional winners for 'Education Institution of the Year' by Basketball England. As a Basketball Academy, we continue to be immensely proud of our students' impressive achievements in this sport and our teams are certainly showing us why they continue to be considered one of the strongest teams regionally. A few weeks ago, the Under 14 Basketball team made the long journey to Durham Johnston School for the first round of the National Schools Competition. In a terrific team performance, NSG ran out comfortable winners, winning 71-31, and it was particularly impressive to see five of our players scoring in double figures. Congratulations to our top scorer Michelle M, who scored 16 points. In the return game, played at NSG last week, the team stormed into a 41-0 lead after just 10 minutes. Coach Goodrich provided wise and competitive guidance on how the team should play, and the final score was 91-14. Once again, Michelle M was the top scorer with 23 points, with Captain Queendy Y very closely behind scoring 18 points.

Our Year 8 Basketball team have also secured exceptional results in the recent Junior NBA tournament. The girls played an impressive two games in London, beating Greig City Academy 58-24 and the hosts, St.Thomas More, 41-20. There was some highly impressive team play, which was remarked upon and admired by the many spectators at the school. In the second tournament, NSG again dominated in both games beating Latymer School 41-15 and North London Collegiate 51-4. The Year 8 team were in excellent form across the four games, with standout performances from Amelia W-M, Freya T-A, Brooke F and Emilie M.















### **English Schools (ESAA) Cross Country Cup Final**

Our cross-country teams have made us immensely proud with their successes in recent weeks. The Junior team finished 8th overall in the Cross Country Cup, with Bella L finishing in 1st place and Amelie H finishing 6th. While the Inters finished in 1st, 2nd, 7th and 15th place, giving them an outstanding score of 25 points which saw them win 1st Team in the Inter Counties Competition. Jess L finished 1st, Claudia T finished 2nd, Emily D finished 7th and Emma M finished 15th. This took them to the Regional Finals in Stowe, where they finished in 5<sup>th</sup> place in bitterly cold and damp conditions.

## **Town Cross Country Championships**

In an impressive and dominant performance at the Cross Country Minor Girls Championships, Bella L led from the start and secured an impressive 1<sup>st</sup> place. Overall, the team finished 5<sup>th</sup> place and the experience provided some invaluable learning. Well done to Evie J and to Amelie H also, who finished 22<sup>nd</sup> and 23<sup>rd</sup> place.

We were pleased to have 13 runners in the Junior Girls Competition, who delivered sensational individual and team performances. There were certainly some delighted faces from very proud staff when the results were shared by the P.E Department in the morning briefing! The team results were incredible and tell the story of fantastic performances in a very strong field: NSG A team came in a strong 1<sup>st</sup> place, NSG B team secured 2<sup>nd</sup> place and NSG C and D teams came in 9<sup>th</sup> and 11<sup>th</sup>.
