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Dear Parents and Carers,

It has been wonderful to welcome our students back to school this week and the kinder weather has meant that even more of them have been enjoying the sunshine and fresh air at break times and lunchtimes.

Following the latest guidance from the Department for Education, it remains our expectation that students continue to wear face masks in lessons and communal areas, including corridors, where it is not possible to maintain a two-metre distance. We are pleased that students are adhering to this expectation so respectfully.

Although many restrictions are now reducing on a national level, we will continue to maintain the zoned areas that we established last September across the school site, as well as the one-way systems and rotas for going into the Clare Dining Room and the food serveries in Oak and Elm. This is making a significant difference in avoiding congestion and also preventing students from mixing between year groups. It is our intention to continue with these measures into next term. We are grateful to everyone for persevering with this.

Extra-curricular and enrichment activities

We are delighted to be resuming even more of our extra-curricular sporting activities from Monday 19th April. The wonderful Faculty of Sport and Performing Arts have done an incredible job in ensuring that our provision is exceptionally broad and inclusive, whilst also making sure that safety measures are in place to mitigate the transmission of COVID-19.

Looking ahead to the summer term, we are in the process of organising some much-needed enrichment and personal development opportunities for Years 7 to 10 and Year 12. Over recent months, students across England have missed out on outdoor education, sport, drama, careers and other activities, and these have always been fundamental to our core offer at NSG. Therefore, we will be arranging for our staff, sports coaches, outside providers and speakers to further enhance our offer in these areas in coming months.

We know that moving in and out of lockdowns over the course of the last year has made it more difficult for parents and carers to access the correct uniform for their children quickly; however, it is important that we continue to maintain our expectations of smart dress for our students.
