## The Role of the Tutor

Your daughter will be **greeted by their tutor each morning** during their daily tutor time. During this time, your daughter can 'check in' with their tutor to make sure they are ready for the school day.

**Your daughter's tutor is the main point of contact between parents/carers and the school** and should be your initial point of contact.

Similarly, if your daughter is worried about anything they **should speak to their tutor initially**. This is the person that is likely to know them best at the school and, therefore, can offer them the most effective immediate support and advice.

# Uniform

## Main Uniform

- **Grey blazer with NSG logo**
- **Northampton School for Girls tie**
- **Grey V neck jumper** (optional)
- **White shirt**
- **Lanyard** (This will be issued in September)
- **Plain black skirt straight** style or pleated, loose fitting and approximately **knee length** (not tight fitting).
- **Plain black tailored trousers**, full length to the ankle. (Black jeans, skinny tight fit trousers, leggings or linen trousers are not allowed.)
- **Plain black shoes** (heels must be a sensible height so that the shoe is a comfortable walking shoe).
- **Plain black leather trainers** are also permitted
- If worn, **religious headwear must be black.**

- **One-piece swimsuit.**

## Jewellery

Students may wear **two items** of jewellery, a pair of earrings count as one item.

**Earrings must be studs** due to health and safety.

We **do not allow** any form of **facial** piercing.

A watch can be worn in addition to two pieces of jewellery.

During lunchtime we have a school shop in the library for students to purchase stationary if required.



## Mobile Phones

Students are expected **not** to bring mobile phones to school. However, parents/carers may feel that it is essential that their daughter has her mobile phone for use on the way to and from school. If this is the case, the following rules apply:

The phone must be **switched off and out of sight** during the school day (**including break and lunch times**).

Students **must not use** their phone under any circumstance during the school day. **We have strict policies around this.**

Should you wish to contact your daughter during the school day, please do so through **student services**.



## Edulink, for parents/carers.

Edulink is the central hub of communication between the school and parents/carers. **On Edulink you can:**

- Contact your daughter's teachers through the messaging function.
- View letters and documents sent via Edulink, this includes letters and academic reports.
- Access and view your daughter's attendance.
- View your daughter's homework, instructions, resources and due dates.

**You will receive a letter in September with further information on how to create an Edulink account.**

## Edulink, for students

Edulink is for students as well! On a student account your daughter will be able to:

- View their homework, instructions, resources and due dates.
- View their timetable, teachers and roomings.

Students will be introduced to Edulink on the first day and will have an opportunity to set up their own account and explore its function within one of their first computing lessons.

Edulink can be accessed through a PC, tablet or smartphone either through a browser or app.

**Do not forget to set up notifications so you know when homework is due and set.**

## Attendance

Attendance to school is fundamental to students success, which is why we have an expectation that all students achieve **97% attendance or higher** throughout the school year.

There may be occasions when your daughter will need to be absent from school due to severe illness or other concerns. Please report absences via the **Edulink app** explaining **the reasoning for their absence on each day of absence**.

If your daughter is feeling unwell, but home remedies or medication would permit them to come to school (for example hayfever) we encourage them to attend. If they are worried, nervous or anxious about any part of school life please encourage them to speak to a member of staff so we are able to support them.





## Catering facilities

Both **Elm** and **Oak** have separate eateries where hot and cold food is available to be purchased at break and lunchtime.

Our **main canteen area**, “Our Kitchen”, offers a wide range of hot food for students to purchase via the cashless system at lunchtime.

**Students who are eligible for free school meals** will be given a preset amount to use to purchase food from the eateries and the main canteen using the same cashless system.

## Your first day

We recommend bringing a packed lunch in the first week, whilst this system is set up. The school will provide lunches for students in receipt of free school meals.
