

A Professional Uniform for a Professional Future

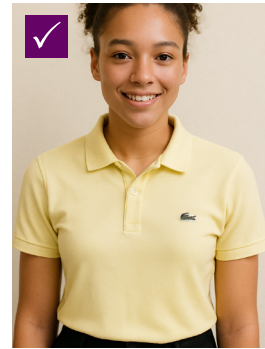
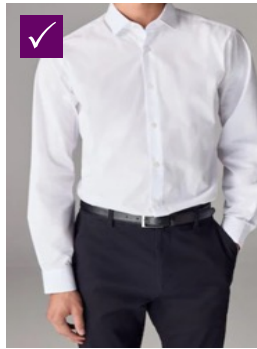
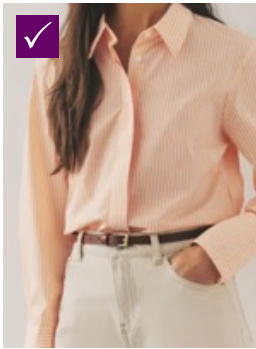

Examples of acceptable shirts and blouses

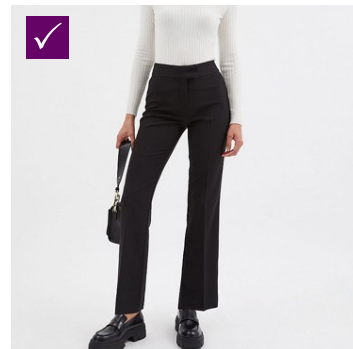
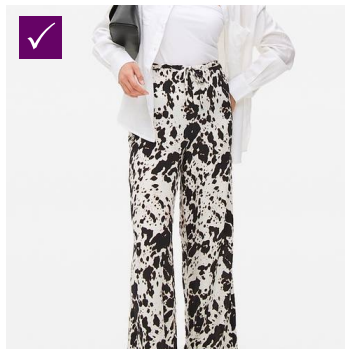


A smart collared shirt or blouse or polo shirt. All colours and small logos/motifs are acceptable.

UNACCEPTABLE ITEMS

No slogans, offensive language, images, large logos/motifs or see through material.
This applies to all items of clothing worn in the Sixth Form, detailed in this document.

Examples of acceptable trousers

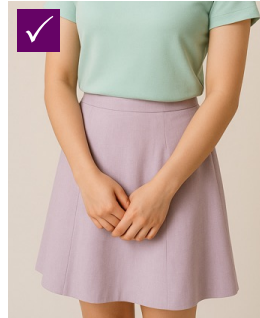


Smart ankle length trousers e.g. tailored or chinos, wide legged and flared trousers.

UNACCEPTABLE ITEMS

Denim, leather, joggers, leggings and cargo trousers are not permitted.

Examples of acceptable skirts and dresses

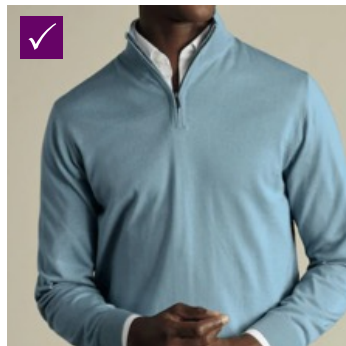


All skirts and dresses must be, at minimum, just above knee length (in-keeping with the uniform in main school – this is the width of a lanyard holder). Students may wear full length skirts, or skirts below the knee, including an abaya. Any tights worn must be plain.

UNACCEPTABLE ITEMS

No denim, body con, leather. No revealing necklines, and no fish net tights.

Examples of acceptable jumpers and cardigans

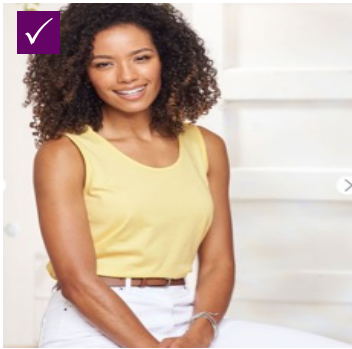


Students can wear smart round-neck or v-neck jumpers/cardigans, and quarter zips that are knitted material. Jumpers can be worn in any colour and small logos/motifs are permitted.

UNACCEPTABLE ITEMS

No sportswear, hoodies, sweatshirts.

Examples of acceptable tops and t-shirts

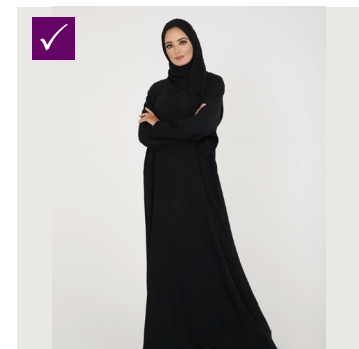
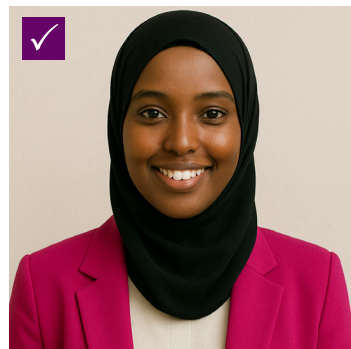


All tops and t-shirts must have sleeves. Vest tops and waistcoats must have thick straps (at least 3cm in width). For male dress, t-shirts and shirts must have a collar.

UNACCEPTABLE ITEMS

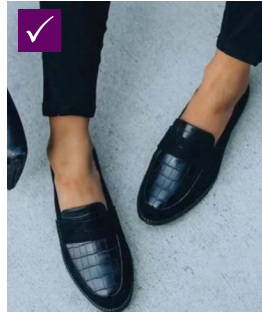
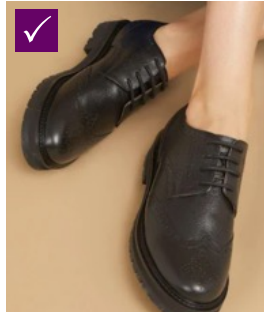
No crop tops, revealing necklines or midriffs or spaghetti straps.

Examples of acceptable religious clothing



Plain coloured hijab - Sikh students may wear a plain coloured turban.

Footwear



Smart, closed toe shoes or boots and plain black trainers.

UNACCEPTABLE ITEMS

Crocs, sliders, coloured/white trainers, knee high boots, flip flops, sandals.

Other details

Blazer and suit jackets are welcome but not essential. Caps, hats, scarves, sunglasses and outdoor coats can be worn to and from school but must be taken off once inside the school building.

Headphones and earbuds are not permitted.

Students can wear small items of jewellery, for example stud earrings and nose studs (not hoops) but other facial piercings (eyebrows and tongues) are not allowed. We expect students to have a continuous unbroken line of clothing from the neck to just above their knee and the Professional Uniform is to be upheld throughout all seasons.

Students will be issued with a Year 12 coloured lanyard when they start in September. Lanyards are a compulsory part of uniform across the whole school and must be worn during the school day. If students do not arrive in school with their lanyard they will be issued with a temporary replacement for the day. If they lose their lanyard, they will need to purchase a new one from our Sixth Form team.

Students who do not meet the Professional Uniform requirements will be subject to sanctions.
